

Conditions of Use:

1. Internet users will sign-in at the Reference Desk. The Internet stations will be available on a first-come first-served basis. Through signature users are agreeing to the library policies.
2. There is a 30 minute time limit if others are waiting.
3. Internet users must have read the Internet Access Policy, and must have signed "Registration and User Agreement" form on file.
4. The library Internet computer is provided for library-related learning, research, and information. All patrons are expected to use this resource in a responsible manner, consistent with the educational and informational purposes for which it is provided.
5. It is the responsibility of parents, guardians, or caregivers to determine what is appropriate information for their own children to access and view.
6. Underage users will not give their name, home address, or phone number out on the Internet.
7. Please ask staff assistance before printing. Printing off the Internet will cost 10 cents per page. Disks are available for \$1.00.
8. Users cannot use their own disc or software programs on the library's computer. This will help prevent computer viruses that are common on COMMUNITY computers. The reference desk will have disks available for a nominal price.
9. Although a virus-checker is used on the Internet Access computer, this will not completely protect you from the chance of getting a virus. The Colwich Community Library has no control over computer programs available through the Internet. Any loss of data, damage, or liability that may occur, or from disc purchased from the library, and from patron use of files obtained through library access is not the responsibility of the library.
10. Users are encouraged to return to the initial search screen "home page" as a courtesy to the next user. This will also protect the privacy of their search.

Users may not:

1. Install any software or damage any library equipment.
2. Alter or damage software, change configurations or settings, or attempt unauthorized entry into any computer system.
3. Send harassing messages, or harass others.
4. Violate copyright laws or software licensing agreement.
5. Violate others users' right to privacy or interfere with others' accessing and viewing material.
6. Engage in any activity which is disruptive to other library users.
7. Violate Federal, State, or local laws or regulations.
8. Perform illegal acts involving library computer resources. User could be subject to prosecution by local, state, or federal authorities.
